The United Way of Olmsted County's Technology Summit aims to inspire the nonprofit and government sectors with innovative ways to achieve efficiencies and dedicate more resources to their missions of helping people.

The summit also introduces technology resources and spotlights successes of several area organizations whose way of doing business has been significantly improved through their incorporation of technology solutions.

Keynote speaker, Bill Matson, came to Pathways from the nation's largest nonprofit organization, where he coordinated housing and drug treatment services for a large metropolitan area.

Before entering the nonprofit world fifteen years ago, he was an award

winning broadcast journalist. Matson has been a member of the board of directors of the National Human Services Data Consortium since 2003 and now serves as the NHSDC's president.

Pathways supports human services providers with a variety of tools that encourage collaboration, reduce costs and increase impact, so more people find the path to success.

Pathways Community Network was founded in 1995 as a collaboration of 28 nonprofit and local government agencies in metropolitan Atlanta that are committed to providing their clients with greater access to care, and more effective care.

To achieve these goals, Pathways developed and implemented PATHWAYS

COMPASS, a world class, on demand community information sharing system that now connects 260 public and private human services organizations in four states.

Launched in early 1999, the PATHWAYS COMPASS system developed by Pathways Community Network has been honored

for technical excellence by *PC WEEK*, Technology Managers Forum, and the U.S. Dept. of Housing and Urban Development. Pathways has also been selected as one of five global winners of the Ericsson Internet Community Awards (ERICA Awards).
