Legislative Priorities

Key Priorities

- Support legislative efforts that positively impact talent attraction, retention, and training needs to meet the evolving workforce needs of the Rochester region.
- Support legislative efforts that encourage development, promote sustainability, and enhance the Rochester region through investments in infrastructure and projects that positively impact the regional business community.

Workforce

- Support legislation that reduces barriers to employment and addresses workforce gaps through licensure reform in high-demand careers (Nurse Licensure Compact).
- Promote the development of workforce programs and initiatives that develop career pathways, encourage partnerships between industry and education, and increase awareness of high-demand job opportunities.
- Advocate for legislation that addresses business concerns relating to existing mandates (Paid Family and Medical Leave) through modifications that support business growth and operational sustainability.

Infrastructure

- Support Olmsted County and the City of Byron's request for state bonding funds to enhance safety and mobility along the Highway 14 corridor through the construction of interchanges on TH14 at CSAH 3 and CSAH 5, supporting regional development along the TH14 corridor.
- Support the City of Rochester's request for state bonding funds to expand sewer and water pipe capacity which would support the development of 1,000 acres for housing.
- Address regional housing needs through the development and expansion of initiatives and resources, while advocating for balanced regulations that encourage development.

General Business

- Support legislative efforts to enhance grid reliability, achieve sustainability goals, and strengthen baseload power capacity through the removal of the nuclear moratorium.
- Encourage effective economic development through tax reform, support
 of programs and incentives, and a streamlined permitting process that
 enables investment, drives business growth, and makes Minnesota
 competitive in business attraction and retention.
